

#### **BONFIRES**

Burning domestic waste

You cannot get rid of household waste if it will cause pollution or harm people's health. This includes burning it.

You can get rid of household or garden waste by composting or recycling it. Contact your local council to find out how to dispose of garden waste and about recycling in your area.

You could be fined if you light a fire and allow the smoke to drift across the road and become a danger

Complain about a neighbour's bonfire

Your council has a responsibility to investigate complaints of smoke and fumes that could be a statutory nuisance.

They can issue an 'abatement notice' if a neighbour's bonfire is causing a nuisance. Your neighbour can be fined if they do not follow the rules of the abatement notice.

It would seem that we have someone in the High Street who is having bonfires. This is a very selfish thing to do, is not good for your wellbeing, and smoke filled washing is not appreciated and your neighbours like to enjoy the FRESH AIR. You can pay £50 per year to have an extra brown bin which is much better.

# DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' REPORT

Charlotte Cane & John Trapp -East Cambs, Bottisham Ward

The Council budget for 2022/23 was passed on 22 February, including a Council Tax freeze to recognise the cost of living challenges facing many residents. We supported the Council Tax freeze and proposed an amendment to devolve the Rural Services Delivery Grant of £169.000 to Parish Councils, and to allocate £10,000 to investigate options for Civil Parking Enforcement, to address the problems caused by illegal parking around the district. This would have been funded by joining the Combined Authority's Community Led Housing Support service, saving the costs of providing it in-house and drawing on the extensive experience of ACRE in community engagement. We also proposed to cut the £25,000 (33 per cent) proposed increase to the Council's PR budget. This amendment was defeated. East Cambs is a relatively small part of the total Council Tax bill, which includes tax for the County Council, Police, Fire services and Parish Council, so our Council Tax bills will increase from April, even though East Cambs' element will not increase.

We also unanimously passed a motion thanking residents in East Cambs for their exemplary behaviour during the lockdown periods, during which very few Fixed Penalty Notices were given to our residents for breaching Covid Lockdown rules and volunteers helped those in need. We also thanked health professionals and all those in public office and leadership positions who worked hard to lead by example. The administration deleted the section which would have shared the severe disappointment of many East Cambs residents that this leadership and responsibility had not been demonstrated by the Prime Minister, Boris Johnson

At this meeting, the questions from the public revolved around actions to address the Climate Emergency. One asked about the provision of electric vehicle charging points and highlighted how few points there were in East Cambs and that many of those had not been working for several months. Another asked for the Council to bring pressure on the Local Authority Pension scheme to disinvest from fossil fuels.

Our bin days changed at the end of March to make the routes more efficient and save 12 tonnes of carbon dioxide every year. Your normal collection days are Monday, but this will change temporarily around Easter and the May Bank Holiday.

# CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL & EAST CAMBRIDGESHIRE DISTRICT UPDATE

WOODDITTON DIVISION

Alan Sharp & Amy Starkey

Since my last report, there have been meetings of Highways & Transport Committee and a Full Council meeting of the County Council.

I spoke at the Highways & Transport Committee about my grave concern over the safety of the A1303 between Newmarket and Bottisham, considering that there have been two deaths on that road within the last two months and am very concerned over the safety of this road. I have asked for a briefing from officers about what can be done about reducing the danger. As your County Councillor, I want to ensure that travel within the area that I represent is as safe as possible. I have thoughts on how we can achieve safer roads, but welcome comments from residents on any concerns or solutions that you may have.

There was a Full County Council meeting on the  $15^{\rm th}$  March and I have many concerns about the attempt by the ruling Liberal Democrat administration to suppress democracy.

There were two examples of this, with the first being a change by the ruling Administration preventing items relating to planning or items of major national significance being debated by Cambridgeshire County Council. This change was brought by the ruling group because at the previous Full Council, the ruling group refused to vote on a motion brought expressing concern about a proposed incinerator in Somersham that has concerned many residents in that locality. This will mean that items such as East West Rail and Sunnica will not in future be debated by the County Council, so your Councillor will be suppressed from commenting on those issues and representing residents.

The second example is the motion that I brought before Council at the meeting expressing the concern of residents over the proposed imposition of congestion charging in Greater Cambridge that will hit the poorer members of society the hardest and asking that the Liberal Democrat Ruling Group consider voting against any such proposals on the Greater Cambridge Partnership, when attending as representatives of the County Council.

My motion was opposed by the ruling group, and they voted to ignore genuine concerns from residents.

The solution to solving the traffic problem within Greater Cambridge is a difficult one, but I will continue to strive to achieve a solution that represents the aims of all residents.

I look forward to updating residents further next month and continue to work on your behalf. If any resident wants to discuss any issue, then please feel free to contact me. Alan Sharp Cambridgeshire County Councillor & East Cambridgeshire District Councillor - Woodditton Division



The season of Spring in our wonderful climate often catches us by surprise. We can have the most glorious sunshine - it might look very warm but walk down to Devil's Dyke and you will regret not taking your coat. We might have rain, but sometimes it is

warm and refreshing. For many of us, of different faiths or none, it is a time that reminds us of new life. From when we first see buds forming on what almost look like dead sticks on our trees up through the times of May Blossom (now often seen in April, of course) we are reminded that life renews. I remember the woodland on the Chiltern Hills where I had grown up being significantly damaged by the 1987 storms with many trees uprooted and the landscape looking rather desolate. Yet nature has its way of renewal and it has been fascinating to see that over the years. In some parts this has been managed by specific planting but in others, areas have been left deliberately letting nature take its own action. It's difficult to say which looks better now.

As a Christian I believe that Christ's resurrection at Easter shows us a victory over death; the signs of new life around us act as a reminder of that.
