



### EAST CAMBRIDGESHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL/ CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL REPORTS

## Congestion Charging & Newmarket Road Access

We await the result of the Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP) consultation on implementing a £5 congestion charge between 7am and 7pm on weekdays across the Greater Cambridge area, which is due to be released in the middle of the year.

The GCP are currently consulting on another proposal in terms of Newmarket Road access and widening bus lanes and footpaths with more bus lanes, which will restrict the road for vehicles.

Additionally, the consultation includes moving the Newmarket Road Park & Ride from its current site to a location on the left just before the Airport Way roundabout, which is the first roundabout that you come to after leaving the A14. Please go on to the GCP website and look at the consultation.

I have asked questions of the GCP as to what modelling has been done on the effect on traffic, if Newmarket Road access is restricted and Mill Road bridge is closed, which comes to Highways & Transport Committee on 7<sup>th</sup> March, especially along Coldham's Lane and Cherry Hinton Road.

#### County Council Budget

The ruling administration on the County Council voted through a 4.99% for Council Tax from April 2023. This was made up of 2% ringfenced for adult social care and a general increase of 2.99%.

This increase is imposed despite cutting winter gritting budgets, verge cutting and weed killing on verges and maintaining the highways maintenance budget at the same level, despite the huge increases in construction costs, which means that is a cut to services

We opposed those cuts and proposed a smaller increase of 4% and maintaining the winter gritting and verge cutting budgets, together with using available reserves to put more money into highways maintenance, but this was voted down.

#### Highways

Please continue to report potholes online. However, if you are unable to report online or repairs seem not to be happening, then please contact me and I will get the issue reported and repairs actioned as soon as possible.

# East Cambridgeshire District Council Budget

The Conservative controlled East Cambs District Council at its meeting on  $21^{st}$  February, agreed a nil increase in their part of the Council Tax, which is the tenth year that there has been no increase, which is a record for any council at District Council level. The District Council has a balanced budget for the next two years and in the current climate, we feel that is important.

I am elected to represent residents and I will continue to do that to the best of my ability, but if there is

anything that concerns you, please contact me and I will try to fix it.

If any resident wants to meet me or call to discuss a particular issue, then please feel free to contact me. I want to hear comments from everyone, as that is the only way that I can truly represent you.

If you can't use on-line forms, please contact the Council on 01353 665555. If you cannot show photographic ID when you go to vote, you will not be given a ballot paper.

The Council approved a budget with no increase in Council Tax. Charlotte seconded an amendment to the budget which also would not have increased the Council tax but included funding for:

- a new Local Plan, to protect our towns and villages from inappropriate development;
- implementation of Civil Parking Enforcement;
- doubling the Environment Fund; and
- setting up a small grant fund for parish councils and community groups to mark the coronation.

But this amendment was lost.

#### LETTER FROM ROSEMARY

By the time you get to read this article, the period of Lent will be a distant memory. But hopefully the period of Holy Week will have made some kind of an impact on us before we reach Easter.

Holy week starts with Palm Sunday, where we think of the bravery of Jesus, knowing full well of the Horrors of the Crucifixion that awaited Him in Jerusalem. We are told that Jesus set His face towards Jerusalem, towards His destiny.

Jesus was to go there with His Disciples to celebrate one of the most important Jewish festivals of the year, that being the Passover. When the Jewish nation remembered the time when the Egyptian pharaoh eventually decided to let their nation go from their captivity as slaves in Egypt. So that they could follow their God into freedom and eventually arrive in their new-home being the 'promised land'.

Jesus used this very public arrival to Jerusalem, to make a bold statement.

Word had now got out that Jesus was the longed for Messiah. The Jewish people were expecting some kind of a climax to his ministry. They were hoping for a military leader who would lead them into another Exodus. This leadership would enable them to be rid of the Romans so they could enjoy the delights of the promised land as a free nation.

Jesus was indeed coming to Jerusalem for a big show down. The atmosphere must have been electric. The crowds would have expected Jesus to arrive in a carriage or on horseback or some mode of transport befitting a leader. Instead, He arrived on a lowly foal of a donkey. Interestingly enough the irony seemed to escape the crowd as they were just so excited to see Him. There was an incredible amount of joyful noise, shouts of Hosanna and much open demonstrations of love by people waving palm branches and throwing their cloaks on the ground in front of the young donkey.

Sadly, the joy of Palm Sunday turns to the agony of Good Friday.

But where all hope seemed to be lost from the pain and death of Jesus and fear and grief took over those who had faithfully stayed with Jesus at Golgotha. A great darkness overed the land. But just as Easter morning arrived like the early spring mornings we are experiencing at the moment with the sunrise and the dawn chorus. So the slow realisation that death appears is not the end. The Resurrection happens and the despair and disbelief, turn to amazement and ecstatic joy.

Jesus came to earth as a leader. The main role of a leader is to show the way forward for everyone.

Yes life can be difficult and yes we do have to face suffering and death. But in the same way Jesus showed us there will always be an Easter Morning for us all, we too can be part of our own resurrection. Hallelujah. Rosemary Rycraft
