#### District Councillors' Report

Charlotte Cane & John Trapp East Cambs - Bottisham Ward

At the Operational Services Committee on 13th June, John was assured that the problems with delayed bin collections are over, and that the previous excellent service will be resuming. There will be some catch up over missed collections. It was reported at the meeting that they had brought in additional contracted recycling collection to assist with the catch-up and that they have a new HGV driver. For the longer term, they are recruiting further HGV drivers, looking at in-cab technology to help with the rounds and working with the unions to support staff. This covers many of the measures suggested by us and colleagues, which is welcome. In addition we would like to see additional management support; a staff survey; reviewing HGV driver pay, as it is well below local HGV roles which are being advertised; and a review of the service to build in more resilience. Waste collection is a service which we all rely on and we will continue to press for the changes needed to provide a sustainable and reliable service.

At the Annual Meeting of the Council in May, the representation on the committees was confirmed, and both of us are on the same committees as last year: Charlotte: Audit Committee, Ethical Guidance John Trapp: Finance & Assets, Operational Services, Plannina

We are also substitutes on other committees. Alan Sharp continues as the Chair of Council and Anna Bailey continues as Leader of the Council.

Our next Councillor's surgery is on Thursday 21 July at 6.30pm at the Pavilion on the Denny at Swaffham Bulbeck, and at the Black Horse in Swaffham Bulbeck at 7.30pm. There will not be a surgery in August, but we are always happy to be contacted if you want to raise anything with us.

#### MINDFULNESS - PAYING ATTENTION

Have you ever noticed we seem to have fads or fashions for words or phrases that nobody has heard of before as it's a technical term that is only used by a few experts in a given set of circumstances?

A fad word that is being bandied around in recent years seems to be 'Mindfulness'. If you Google this word, you will see it has many explanations, very few seem at all relevant to ordinary life. So let me try and clarify this for you. Mindfulness is basically a means to concentrate on one thing at a time.

The A&E department of any hospital is full of people having had accidents who will tell a tale of the situation where they weren't paying attention to what

they were doing, and so and so happened and they ended up injuring themselves. Or they hadn't tidied up after a meal or after having done some gardening which resulted in somebody tripping over a rake or a stool which was left some where it shouldn't have been

To train ourselves up for being able to concentrate on the task in hand we are told to get in touch with our inner selves, so we can be content with who or what we are.

As a well-known prayer goes:-

'To know the things we can change. To be able to cope with the things we cannot change. To be able to recognize the difference.

There are courses which can help, of course there always are. One of the biggest benefits of a course is to recognize the fact that you are not the only one who is struggling with feeling inadequate and, in an effort to cope, keep hopping from one job to the other, to try and put things right.

Praying and meditating on a regular basis can help, as both these activities train you to focus on your life and desires in a analytical manner. Being analytical strips away the emotion and helps us see things clearly.

Once we get used to focusing, we get rid of the need to ignore a difficult situation. We learn to take control and enjoy taking a part in the life we are leading.

If anyone was good at being focused it was Jesus Christ. Perhaps it would be a good idea to reread the Gospel reading each week and notice just how focused Jesus was. It may surprise you. Yes, Jesus was a good teacher and for us to be a good student we need to realise Jesus was focused, and by being Mindful on what He has asked us to do means we can achieve, rather than just survive.
