REPORT FROM LUCY FRAZER SPEEDING IN BURROUGH GREEN

Many constituents in Burrough Green have contacted me with their concerns about speeding in the local area.

I was pleased to meet with Special Constable, Thomas Howard, in Burrough Green recently for an update on the work that the police are doing to crack down on speeding. Recent data suggests that almost half of drivers passing through on the B1061 are breaking the 30mph speed limit. 62 penalties were issued in January.

During my visit two cars were stopped for speeding, and many others visibly reduced their speed due to the presence of the police. Thank you to County Councillor Alan Sharp and Parish Councillor Tom Rusk who joined me and for all their work on this issue.

### VACCINE CONFIDENCE SURVEY TOOLKIT FOR PARTNERS

Researchers Alison Ward and Cristina Devecchi from the University of Northampton have been commissioned by Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Clinical Commissioning Group, in association with Cambridgeshire County Council and Peterborough City Council to research into reasons for vaccine hesitancy in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.

### CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL & EAST CAMBRIDGESHIRE DISTRICT UPDATE

Alan Sharp & Amy Starkey - Woodditton Ward

Since my last report, there have been meetings of both Children & Young People Committee and Highways & Transport Committee and two Full County Council meetings.

The Children & Young People Committee considered issues around the final funding for schools next year. The Local Transport & Connectivity Plan for Cambridgeshire was due to go out for a period of 12 weeks public consultation during February 2022.

The Highways & Transport Committee met in January, and we were presented with the current projects that the County Council are undertaking and discussed a proposal for a separate scheme to implement 20mph zones within the County. I argued, that 20mph zones are great, but in the rural areas, I am battling to get 60mph zones down to 40mph with little help from the various agencies. I will continue to fight for safer roads throughout the County, especially within my division, whether that be 20mph, 30mph or 40mph zones. Although that will not stop everyone speeding, it will reduce the speed of the vast majority, who obey speed limits and will continue to target those who totally ignore those limits.

The Budget meeting of Council was held on 8<sup>th</sup> February and the ruling group proposed a budget increase of 4.99%, which is the maximum allowed before a referendum of residents is required. The increase was composed of 3% adult social care and a general increase of 1.99%. Our group agreed with the social care increase but felt that there was no need for the 1.99% increase, as it was not to be used for extra services but put into reserves. This increase was despite receiving over £4m more than expected from Government and putting extra pothole monies received from Government into reserves rather than using them for Highway repair. The ruling group in their budget have proposed £100k in a feasibility study around flooding. Our group feel that residents deserve better and proposed £4m to be used to counter flood issues from an earmarked reserve budget. Our proposals were voted down, so all residents will see a 4.99% in the County Council's portion of the Council Tax bill.

East Cambridgeshire District Council met to agree their budget on 22<sup>nd</sup> February and for the ninth year running, a nil increase was agreed, which shows how good management of public money can work, whilst retaining public services.

If you aware of an issue that concerns you, please let me know. If I am not aware of it, I cannot fix it.

I look forward to updating residents further next month and continue to work on your behalf.

<u>Charlotte Cane & John Trapp – Bottisham Ward</u> NEW REFUSE COLLECTION DATES .

From 28th March 2022 our waste will be collected on new days. For Bottisham, Brinkley, Lode and Westley Waterless the waste will be collected on Mondays and Reach, Swaffham Bulbeck and Swaffham Prior on Tuesdays. Our waste will be collected on these days for 2 weeks and then we will move onto the Easter timetable. Bottisham, Brinkley, Lode and Westley Waterless on Saturday 9 April and Tuesday 19 April and Reach, Swaffham Bulbeck and Swaffham Prior on Monday 11 April and Wednesday 20 April. Then we will move back to Mondays and Tuesdays. In addition, the pattern of collection of green and blue bins will change - they will still be alternate weeks, but you may get Blue bins collected two weeks in a row when you first move to the new days. ECSS will be delivering letters to each household which should make all of this clear.

We apologise that this may be a bit confusing. We will be asking why the changes were introduced just before the temporary changes necessitated by the two Easter Bank Holidays.

We have been assured that reconfiguring the waste rounds will ensure that the service will operate more efficiently, reducing the fluctuations on resource demand and removing unnecessary travel. We were pleased to hear that the new arrangements will reduce ECSS's annual carbon output by about 12 tonnes CO2 per year.

The budget proposals for the coming year were on the agenda for the Finance & Assets Committee on Monday 24 January. These were in line with the Medium-Term Financial Strategy which was approved by the council in its budget last year. However, the Leader of the Council moved an amendment at the meeting to delete all the budget recommendations in their entirety and refer the decision on the budget to the Full Council meeting on Tuesday 22 February, with no recommendation at all from the committee.

The County Council are creating a new heritage website for Cambridgeshire, with the aim of improving the availability of local heritage lists. Once this is up and running you will be able nominate buildings and sites as local heritage assets - https://local-heritagelist.org.uk/cambridgeshire

Jubilee Gardens in Ely celebrated 20 years since it was opened by HRH the Duke of Edinburgh in February 2002. Charlotte was one of the Councillors at the time who pressed the administration at the Council to retain this green space rather than selling it as a building plot - Lib Dems celebrate 20 years of Jubilee Gardens Ely (ecld.org.uk). She wanted people to be able to walk through park land from the river to the Cathedral, rather than having to navigate between buildings. It's disappointing that 20 years later we are still having to fight across this ward to protect local green space from development pressures.

It has been an exciting couple of weeks since our last report for both the cadets and staff. Starting with the delivery of the squadron's new flight simulator.

Sim2Do have done an excellent job, and our portable sim is up and running on squadron.

This will bring a great advancement to the aviation training we can offer and there was much excitement upon its first use. The official unveiling of the simulator to parents will be at our annual presentation



evening at the end of February.

The first order of training for the sim is basic ground school and effects of controls lessons ahead of our return to powered Air Experience Flying in the Grob Tutor aircraft.

We have had two staff promotions on the squadron, with officers Debbie Keenan and Bradley Wright being promoted to Flying Officer. As Covid restrictions have eased both Flying Officers' Keenan and Wright were able to attend an awards ceremony where they were presented their commissioning scrolls by the Deputy Lord Lieutenant of Cambridgeshire.

A Lent course will be held during Lent on Monday mornings at 10.30am at 68 Station Road, Dullingham beginning on Monday 7th March

You may have heard the weather proverb, "If March comes in like a lion, it will go out like a lamb," which means that if the month starts off stormy, it will end with mild weather. As I write this message, although not quite in March, we are experiencing some extraordinary storms and strong winds which certainly prepare us for March coming in like a lion! March also brings the start of Spring and in this poem by Elizabeth Akers Allen (1832–1911) we can read of both the perils of strong winds and the promise of Spring.

"Bleak winds assault us all around: Dances aloft, or skims the ground: See the school-boy - his hat in hand, While on the path he scarce can stand. The wild and windy spring.

The brown buds thicken on the trees, Unbound, the free streams sing, As March leads forth across the leas The wild and windy spring."

Spring is the season of new beginnings, a festival of awakening and rebirth. Fresh buds bloom, animals awaken and the earth seems to come to life again. Farmers and gardeners plant their seeds and temperatures slowly rise. The dark months are now over and we're moving into the warmth of the light. It's also a time for new ideas and new dreams for your life.

The Christian festival of Lent also starts in March, another time for thoughts and new opportunities. It begins with Ash Wednesday on March 2nd and is a period of 40 days during which Christians remember the events leading up to and including the death of Jesus Christ, whose life and teachings are the foundation of Christianity.

The 40-day period is called Lent after an old English word meaning 'lengthen'. Linked to the Old Germanic root word "lango-", which means "long", many believe the word Lent is related to the lengthening of days over the season. In fact, the Anglo-Saxon name for March - the month Lent usually falls in - was "lenctentid", which means "springtide".

Lent is a time of reflection and of asking for forgiveness, and when Christians prepare to celebrate Jesus's resurrection at the feast of Easter, which comes at the very end of Lent. In line with the tradition of fasting during Lent many people decide to give up their favourite food. However, instead of giving up chocolate, fizzy drinks or chips, many others use Lent as a period to help others. Hundreds of people take part in the Lenten Positive Acts Challenge as another way to show praise for God. Participants perform one positive act for each of the days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday. These acts can include calling up someone who is alone, donating to a worthy cause, clearing up after dinner and letting someone go ahead of you in a supermarket queue. Perhaps this is something we can all aspire to, regardless of our religious belief or personal faith. Anthea
