## POTHOLES

#### A message from the office of Lucy Frazer

A source of concern and frustration for many of her constituents!

It is important that our roads are kept in good condition to ensure the safety of road users, cyclists and pedestrians. Over the past several months, the combination of heavy rain and freezing temperatures has led to several new potholes which I know have caused concern for many of you.

I am pleased that in the Spring Budget the Chancellor announced that the Government will place an extra £200 million towards the Potholes Fund. This takes the total pothole budget for UK local authorities to £700 million in the 2023/24 financial year. The uplift will mean an additional £4.1 million for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.

Although it is the responsibility of Cambridgeshire County Council to repair the highways in my constituency, I have always been happy to report problems on behalf of my constituents and follow-up with the authority if any issues remain outstanding.

## EAST CAMBRIDGESHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL/

### CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL REPORT Charlotte Cane (she/her)

Councillor for Bottisham Ward

(Bottisham, Brinkley, Lode, Reach, Swaffham

Bulbeck, Swaffham Prior and Westley Waterless) We hope everyone will enjoy the three Bank Holiday weekends in May, with Reach Fair, the Coronation Big Lunch and the Spring Bank Holiday. Because of these holidays, there are changes to the bin collection days in May. For the weeks beginning 1, 8 and 29 May bins will be collected one day later than usual. Rubbish will be collected on the normal days in the weeks beginning 15 and 22 May.

The GCP (Greater Cambridge Partnership) is expected to publish the results of its consultation in May or early June. It has been reported that they received over 23,000 responses. We are pressing them to listen carefully to the responses. Although we haven't seen the responses yet, we have heard the views of many people locally and expect the responses to the formal consultation to be similar. People overwhelmingly agree that better public transport is needed in Cambridgeshire - restoring Sunday buses, the direct buses to Hills Road and Long Road sixth form colleges and evening buses come high up people's agenda. Many also agree that the Newmarket Road Park & Ride site should be on the Quy side of the roundabout, to ease congestion and provide a choice of routes, eq to Cambridge North, the Science Park and CRC as well as into Cambridge centre. But very few people agree that these should be funded through the proposed Sustainable Travel Zone, or congestion charge. We agree that better buses are needed but that the proposed congestion charge is not fair or equitable for residents here in Bottisham or across East Cambs and so should not be introduced. Unfortunately, East Cambs is not part of the GCP, so we cannot vote on any proposals. But we will continue to meet with representatives of the GCP to highlight the needs of local residents and press the GCP to drop their plans for the congestion charge and work across all local Councils to deliver better buses.

It was reported to the Operational Services Committee that waste collection rates had improved in Jan-March 2023, with 99.87% of all collections achieved first time. But that "resources have continued to be focussed on collection services and this has challenged the ability of the street cleansing service to complete requests. Priority in the street cleansing service is in turn given to higher profile areas within the District." Unfortunately, this means that in Jan-March 2023 just 15% of fly tipping was removed within 2 working days, against a target of 98%. This was also considerably down on last year when 61% was cleared within 2 working days. *Charlotte.Cane@eastcambs.gov.uk*

## Councillor Woodditton Ward & County Councillor Congestion Charge Petition

At the Full County Council meeting on 21<sup>st</sup> March, a petition with nearly 15,500 signatures was presented, asking for a county-wide referendum. Our group put in a motion asking that a county-wide referendum on May 4<sup>th</sup> be held, but this was defeated by the ruling Lib Dem/Labour administration.

### Swaffham Heath Road/ A1303 Crossroads

The County Council are waiting for the signing of the land transfer required to proceed with the staggered junction at these very dangerous crossroads. The delay to the commencement of these works has been very frustrating and it is hoped that work will commence very soon on this much needed road improvement.

## Potholes

I have had a lot of contact from residents about the poor state of roads around the County. I am in constant contact with Highways officers to get the necessary roads repaired to the level that is expected. I fear that getting things done will be harder, as the ruling Lib Dem/ Labour administration have allocated the same amount to roads maintenance in 2023/24 as was spent in 2022/23. With building material inflation running at nearly 20%, this represents a cut to the maintenance budget at the time that we need this budget increased more. This effective cut to road maintenance budgets is after a 4.99% increase in the County Council part of your council tax was voted through by the Lib Dem/Labour administration. So, you are getting less, yet paying more!!

There is some hope, as the Chancellor Jeremy Hunt in the recent budget announced  $\pounds$ 200m extra money for pothole repairs across the country. Cambridgeshire's share is expected to be in excess of  $\pounds$ 3m. I will be doing my best to ensure that this is all directed to dealing with road issues, when the allocation decision is made.

Please continue to report potholes and road deficiencies on the CCC portal, but please keep me informed of any issues, as I will continue to push to get our roads repaired.

#### **District** Council

I had the pleasure as Chairman of the District Council of greeting Prince Edward to the District on 12<sup>th</sup> April, when he visited Harry Specters, a social enterprise chocolate factory in Ely, followed by the official opening of the Viva Arts building in Soham. Both of those enterprises are a credit to the district, and it is wonderful that they have received royal recognition.

There are District Council elections on 4<sup>th</sup> May and I will be standing for election. I look forward to being able to continue to serve residents on the District Council.

May is known as a month of transition. If you live in the northern hemisphere, the fresh cold winds are gone, and the rains of early spring arrive. By the time May comes around, the spring flowers are blooming, birds are chirping, and life is starting to seem a little more joyful day by day! If you're on the other side of the world, in the southern hemisphere, then it's a time when summer is long gone. The autumn winds have swept by, and the nights are getting colder and darker. It's a time of change, yet still delightfully warm. Again, May is a time of change, no matter where in the world you are.

This year, the month of May will see His Majesty King Charles III crowned on Saturday 6th May, at Westminster Abbey, conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury. Buckingham Palace informed us that the Coronation will reflect the monarch's role today and look towards the future, while being rooted in longstanding traditions and pageantry.

So what is a Coronation? The dictionary tells us; Coronation - the act or occasion of crowning but also accession to the highest office. Yet a coronation is both the symbolic religious ceremony during which a sovereign is crowned and the physical act of placing a crown on a monarch's head. It formalises the monarch's role as the head of the Church of England and marks the transfer of their title and powers.

In the Christian church, May also celebrates Ascension Day when we commemorate Jesus Christ's ascension into heaven (as per Christian belief) which occurs on the Thursday, which is 40 (or 39) days after Easter. This year it will take place on May 18. Another example of accession to the highest office.

However, May is known as a month of bank holidays and this year there will be an extra bank holiday across the UK on Monday 8th May. In celebration of the King's Coronation, Buckingham Palace has announced various events for the weekend. Pubs, clubs and bars across England and Wales will be able to stay open for an extra two hours on Friday and Saturday of the coronation weekend and people are also being invited to hold street parties, and to take part in volunteering projects in their local community, as part of the 'Big Help Out' initiative.

Here in Dullingham and in our local villages there are opportunities to join together to celebrate the Coronation and have fun. We have a Benefice Service in Celebration of the Coronation at Westley Waterless Church starting at 10.30am on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> May and a short Act of Celebration at Dullingham Church starting at 12 noon. Please join us, if you can. Let's enjoy this a-may-zing month!
