

The first half term of the new school year has flown by and so much has been learnt and experienced by the school community at Burrough Green.



The children, first and foremost, are incredible - their application to their learning has been first rate and they have produced great work. Teachers are planning incredible things for the children. This - coupled with our small class sizes - mean the children here get the very best education possible.

We have held so many events this half term. Year 6 children have completed Pony Camp - this is a completely free experience provided by the British Horse Racing School and lasts a whole week. A phenomenal activity for the children to partake in. They enjoyed it immensely. Not only does an experience like this teach them about 'all things horse' and potential careers in the industry, but also develops and nurtures their own mental health and well-being being that close to animals is so therapeutic. Mrs Moxom, our music and PE lead, organised Calyco - an up and coming band - to visit and perform at our school. As you can imagine, the children found this such an inspiring event and the whole school loved it. Some year 6 children were then recorded on a 20 minute podcast, which is yet to broadcast - we cannot wait to hear it! You will find some of our children on YouTube with the band if you search carefully! Next month we have Jordan Catchpole - an Olympic Gold Medallist - coming into school to train with the children. Again, another inspiring opportunity.

These 2 events Mrs Moxom has organised, encapsulate what I want for Burrough Green - I want a curriculum filled with 'Awe and Wonder' and those amazing experiences that will inspire this generation are so important. The curriculum is currently under development at Burrough Green and we are all excited about it. We are hoping to launch it, alongside our new and improved website at the end of November.

Our Harvest Festival had the theme 'Harvests from around the World'. The whole service was run by our Prayer Team (Lottie, Macie and Lucy - thank you!) and it was watched by many. The year 6 children came away from the theme to perform two thought provoking poems about foodbanks and the need for them in our society. We collected almost 80Kg of food for local foodbanks. An amazing effort. The festival took place in our beautiful village church - our next visit will be on the 10^{th} November for a Remembrance service - please come along if you can as I'm sure it will be spectacular. I would like to take this opportunity, while talking about our stunning local church, to remind everyone that we are not a faith school for Christians,

but a church school for all – this vision is important, not only to myself but our school.

Parents seem to be in school every week, whether it's for the numerous phonics sessions Mrs Leadbeter has run, Macmillan Afternoon Tea, open afternoons, new parents presentations or just parents wanting to see what the 'buzz' at Burrough Green is all about. If you have children starting in 2024, please consider us - I couldn't be prouder of what we are doing here and would love to share my vision for the future. We have out next presentation for new intake parents (those starting 2024) on the 7th November at 2pm - no booking is necessary. We have space in all classes, so please ring for a viewing and I will be proud to show you around and share my plans and vision for Burrough Green.

Our burgeoning wrap-around-care (Larks and Owls) is really taking off. Children that come are loving the care that is provided for them. The staff, Lisa and Hattie, have been fabulous and we hope the provision goes from strength to strength (one day last week we had over 20% of the school booked into one session!). Parents really seem to be appreciating the service we are providing the community and it is great it is being used so widely.

I think that is everything for now. I have had an excellent first half term and am proud and privileged to call myself the headteacher of Burrough Green. Thank you all for your continued support and I wish you all a restful and memorable month ahead. See you all in November!

LUCY FRASER - REPORT OF 2023

As we come towards the end of 2023, I wanted to look back on the year and let you know about some of the work I have been doing for you as your local Member of Parliament.

When reflecting on the year so far, it seems apt to first highlight the event of the year - the wonderful coronation of Charles III and Camilla as our new King and Queen in early May. As the first coronation this country has seen for seventy years, it was always bound to be a special occasion, but I was moved by the many displays of national unity and celebration I witnessed over the Bank Holiday weekend.

For all its memorable moments, the year has also had its challenges, many of which have been caused by high prices and bills. Although inflation has been driven down from 11.1% to 6.7% in recent months, I know that the cost of living remains a real concern, and I am committed to helping my constituents across South East Cambridgeshire get the support and advice they need.

I also know how important quality healthcare is to my constituents. That's why I have been working with my neighbouring MP, Anthony Browne, and senior leaders at Addenbrooke's Hospital to secure a new cancer hospital at Cambridge Biomedical Campus. I am delighted that the government has approved the Outline Business Case for the Cambridge Cancer Research Hospital. This is a significant milestone in plans to build a new specialist cancer research hospital, which will have a regional, national and global impact. I continue to campaign for the funding required to deliver a new children's hospital on the same site, which would be a world-first specialist facility for children and young people.

As MP for a largely rural constituency, I also appreciate the need for effective bus services. Following my efforts at the end of last year to prevent Stagecoach from axing or significantly altering 23 local bus routes, I was pleased to assist the Combined Authority with the retendering of bus services for at least another 12 months from April 2023. Recently, I have written to the Mayor to call him to identify how he intends to utilise the new £2.3 million government funding for Cambridgeshire's bus network.

I have also been working with Cambridgeshire Constabulary and the Police and Crime Commissioner to get crime down, so that my constituents can feel safer in their communities. The force is at a record size following the government's 'Police Uplift Programme' and I am pleased that it is paying dividends, with neighbourhood crime down 30% and rural crime down 21% across Cambridgeshire.

DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORTS

East Cambs District Council - Bottisham Ward

James Fitch

We were saddened to hear that James Fitch had passed away. James was County Councillor and District Councillor for many years for the Bottisham ward villages. He loved these villages and worked with and for the residents. One of his longest campaigns was to get safe cycle routes, so he was delighted when the Lode to Quy cycle path opened and looked forward to seeing the path from Burwell to Exning open. He knocked on Charlotte's door the day she moved in to Reach to welcome her and her husband to the area and introduce himself as their local Councillor - they were very impressed! They soon realised that he was regularly out and about talking with residents and helping to get things done. More recently, he has given us advice and support and shared his long knowledge of the area with us. Like many people, we shall miss James greatly.

Bin Liners

Everyone should have received their black bin bags by the end of October. If you haven't received yours, please let one of us know, and we will make sure they are delivered.

Finance

After years of refusing to answer questions about the finances and management of its trading companies, and a demand this February for an extra £500,000 in fees for the year to 31 March, the Council has finally admitted significant problems with ECSS and initiated major reforms. The Chief Executive, who is also the Managing Director of ECSS, published a report triggered by a review instigated by the Audit Committee, following a proposal from Charlotte.

There had been a clear indication of one of the major weaknesses when the Council's Observer at ECSS Board meetings, Cllr J Huffer, was asked how frequently she received and reviewed Management Accounts for ECSS and she admitted that "ECSS Board last reviewed the management accounts on 31 January 2023. Prior to this, as it is essentially on operational budget, the Board did not receive management accounts, instead it discussed and approved the annual statutory accounts".

Regular review of Management Accounts is a key control of an organisation's finances. The Audit Committee will be reviewing the report in more detail and Charlotte will be pressing for a thorough and

independent review of governance at ECSS and ECTC (which shares many of the same governance procedures as ECSS).

Transport

The Greater Cambridge Partnership has dropped its plans to charge people driving into and around Cambridge. We are working with colleagues to ensure that we get the much-needed public transport improvements for our area. This will require significant and sustained investment from central government, not just a one-off £2.3m. We were interested to see that the idea of a congestion charge in Cambridge goes back to 1990 when the Conservative County Council adopted 'demand management by road pricing'. This was firmed up by the Conservatives in 2009 with bids to Government for £500m funding to implement a congestion charge on very similar borders to the GCP's proposal, and deliver improvements to public transport, cycle paths etc. The Government funding stream was closed in 2010, and without the funding the County Council paused the scheme.

#### CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

East Cambridgeshire District Council Report (Woodditton Ward)

### Congestion Charge

Residents will have seen that the Liberal Democrats have issued a statement saying that there is not a political consensus around proceeding with the plan for congestion charging within Cambridge. No mention that the majority of residents were against those charges, but purely that at this time they could not proceed.

This was a tax that was not contained in any party's manifesto, and this tax has not gone away. I will continue to represent the views of residents on this tax, that it is ill considered, not wanted and hits at the poorer members of society the hardest.

### Mill Road Bridge

I mentioned previously that in March Highways & Transport Committee at County Council voted to restrict vehicle movement over the bridge to taxis, buses and vehicles of blue badge holders and carers. It was a decision that I voted against and believed was ill-considered. That decision has been subject to a legal challenge, and it looks that the legal challenge has been partially successful, thus there will be no work on any changes until the legal challenge has been finalised.

#### Swaffham Heath Road/ A1303 Crossroads

After many delays, it would appear that work will start immediately after Christmas on improving this junction.

#### Weeds

The ruling administration at Cambridgeshire County Council decided without reference to anybody to stop all weedkilling on roads and pavements within the County.

This has left the County looking in a sorry state.

The ruling Lib Dem/ Labour administration have admitted that they should have consulted first, before pursuing this plan, but appear not keen to reintroduce a proper proposal for next year, which would get issues under control. I will keep residents updated on this issue.

#### **Planning**

I am continuing to ask the East Cambs planning team to monitor the works at the rear of Sheriffs Court, which are being constructed to currently unapproved schemes.

I am here to represent you, so if there are any issues that concern you, please contact me.



As the season has turned and all the Autumn colours are emerging on the trees it is time to turn our thoughts to the end of the year. The church's year is coming to an end and we think about All Hallow's Eve. Halloween's origins can be traced back to the ancient Celtic festival known as Samhain, which was held on October 31st in contemporary calendars. It was believed that on that day, the souls of the dead returned to their homes, so people dressed in costumes and lit bonfires to ward off spirits.

It is the Eve of ALL SAINTS day on 1st November, which is celebrated, and is closely tied with All Souls' Day, which was first instituted at the monastery in Cluny, Burgundy, France in 1030AD by Abbott Odilo and quickly spread throughout the Christian world thus establishing the modern date of All Souls Day. All Saints' Day is also closely linked with Halloween, which is a shortened for the name "All Hallows' Even". All Saints is a time we remember all of those Christian people who have set an example to us all as how we

should live as Christians and have been killed, martyred or died leaving us an example of how we too should live our Christian lives. All of our churches are dedicated to these saints.

All Souls Day is the last day of All Hallow's tide, a Western Christian season and is a time we remember our loved ones who have gone before us.

Then comes a time of Remembrance celebrated nationally on 11<sup>th</sup> November. Remembrance Day (also known as Poppy Day owing to the tradition of wearing a remembrance poppy) is a memorial day observed in Commonwealth member states since the end of the First World War in 1919 to honour armed forces members who have died in the line of duty. The day is also marked by war remembrances in several other non-Commonwealth countries. We remember those who have died in all wars and those who are still dying in conflicts across the world today.

Each church will have some cards and if you have any loved ones you would like to be remembered please leave the card on the altar. May they rest in peace and rise in glory. AMEN
