CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL UPDATE

Alan Sharp Cambridgeshire County Councillor - Woodditton Division

Meetings of the County Council have been reduced by the ruling coalition, which gives less opportunity to scrutinize the decisions that are being made on your behalf.

Since my last report, there has been no meeting of Highways & Transport Committee and I attended a meeting of the Children & Young People Committee on 19^{th} October, which are the policy committees that I am a member of.

EDUCATION

The Children & Young People Committee had an initial look at the budget situation for Education in the next financial year and the budget gap for 2022/23 of nearly £20m that the ruling coalition need to reduce.

TRANSPORT

In terms of the Eastern Access proposals by the Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP), I received a briefing from GCP officers about the proposals to move the Newmarket Road Park & Ride nearer to the A14 Stow-cum-Quy roundabout, as well as increased bus lanes along Newmarket Road and a proposal to reduce vehicle access into the centre of Cambridge. The consultation runs from 3rd November until midday

The consultation runs from 3^{rd} November until midday on 22^{nd} December.

The proposals affect residents in this area, but local Councillors in this area have no representation on the GCP and I have been speaking to GCP officers to voice the concerns that I have.

I would ask that once the consultation opens that you look at the proposals and respond to the consultation. In addition, it would be very helpful for me if you could send me your comments, so that I can try to represent your views in further discussions.

Whilst talking about transport, there is a public consultation by Network Rail which started on 18th October on the Ely Area Capacity Enhancement. It may not directly affect your village, but there needs to be major work done at Ely to alleviate a rail bottleneck, where three lines from the North merge into one, as do two lines from the South. This work is needed so that the number of trains going through Ely can be increased, both passenger and freight, which will increase the container traffic that can be moved by rail, thus reducing the number of trucks on the A14. Please read and contribute to this consultation, as it is important for the rail traffic east of Cambridge if we are to achieve our aim of better and more frequent services running through Newmarket and Dullingham. I would welcome any comments that you may have on the rail proposals.

The County Council have set up a Highways Improvement Board and it had its first meeting on 24th September. I am the East Cambs rep on that Committee and at our first meeting, we discussed the issues of gully cleaning and pothole repairs and

improving the performance in those areas. We are due to meet every 6 weeks and I will update on the progress to improve outcomes in future reports.

If you are aware of an issue that concerns you, please let me know. If I am not aware of it, I cannot fix it. I look forward to updating residents further next month.

East Cambridgeshire District Council Update

District Councillors : Alan Sharp & Amy Starkey - Woodditton Ward

By the time that you read this, the District Council will have held a Full Council meeting. On that agenda is an item around parking enforcement within the district and we will update next month.

The Operational Services and Finance & Assets Committees have recently met the Operational Services Committee starting a review of indoor and outdoor sports facilities within the district. We would welcome any comments or suggestions as to the current facilities and where they could be improved or added to.

The Finance & Assets Committee discussed the regular review of the budget for the Council over the next five years. We have previously advised that the District Council may have to raise their portion of the Council Tax for a Band D property by £5 for the first time in eight years. We will continue to keep that under review over the coming months. If we can avoid having to request an increase, we will do so.

The sad events of 15th October make us all aware of our safety, but our democracy is founded on elected representatives being available to residents and will continue to be available, whilst ensuring our own safety.

At September's meeting of the Operational Services Committee one of the items on the agenda was a proposal for enforcement of car parking regulations in the District. At the meeting it was announced that that item would be deferred for consideration by Full Council in October.

Operational Services Committee also approved the outdoor sports facilities and playing fields strategy

which includes the aims of "securing provision, improvement and maintenance of outdoor sport and playing pitches across the district". This was in the same month that consultation closed on the Council's plans to demolish the Outdoor Activities centre at Mepal and replace it with a crematorium and burial site even though the Council's own consultation showed that most residents don't support the proposal.

The Committee heard a presentation from Newmarket Citizens' Advice Bureau (CAB) in which it was noted that requests for advice had increased, notably for advice around benefits and tax credits, debts, employment and relationships. Audits of the services and governance of Newmarket CAB had rated it as good. East Cambs funds the Newmarket CAB for around £23k per year.

Finance & Assets Committee considered the Medium Term Financial Strategy Update. This assumes that Council tax will rise by £5 (for a Band 4, and in proportion for other Bands) each year from 2022 and that inflation will be 2% (although the Bank of England is predicting 4%) and still notes that in order to set a legal budget for 2022/23 East Cambs will need to deliver:

- · Efficiencies in the cost-of-service delivery
- · Reductions in service levels
- · Increased income from fees and charges
- Increased commercialisation via its trading companies

One of the cost reductions which we fear the Administration may impose is the grant to Newmarket CAB, putting its services to local residents at risk, and thereby removing an independent advice service.

To give you some idea of the comparative savings required: the planned increase in Council Tax is about 3.5%, and the ECDC income from Council Tax is about £4.5 million; interestingly, the Parish precept is just over half of the income that ECDC receives in Council Tax (and the Council receives other taxes and grants, so the income from Council Tax is about a third of its total income); the savings required in three years' time is almost £4 million.
