If we have not seen you for a while - for all the obvious reasons - please know you will have been thought about, and we would really appreciate a call to let us know all is well with you and yours.



MARSH MAIL - News from Linton Village College Coming back to school this autumn term has felt particularly special as we've been able to enjoy returning to subject-based teaching with the removal of a number of Covid-19 restrictions such as year group bubbles and zones.

It is also great to see the College buzzing with extracurricular and enrichment activities for our students and the wider community. The restarting of adult education classes in September is an important aspect of our commitment to life-long learning that we were keen to see back on the calendar.

While remaining cautious and maintaining health and safety measures, we are hopeful that a number of college events will be able to take place this term. We are looking forward to welcoming back our outgoing Year 11s for an awards ceremony/mini prom to celebrate their GCSE results and their time at LVC on 1st October. Observing their arrival will be limited to parents on this occasion to avoid large crowds on site. It is also great to be able to welcome Year 6 parents and students for a face-to-face Open Evening this year on 7th October. Families wishing to attend will need to book a place on a tour in advance. We'll also have a range of online materials to showcase the College.

We're delighted with the results of our recent Ofsted monitoring visit and details are now available on our website. The report shows the progress that has been made since our last inspection in February 2020 and recognises that we are taking effective action to become a good school. It is pleasing to see external validation of the improvements that have been achieved by college staff over the last 18 months, especially considering how much educational disruption we have also managed successfully, including remote learning.

Some highlights from the letter from the lead inspector include students' views shared in the report that LVC 'is really inclusive and welcoming' and recognition that changes made to improve the curriculum experience, SEND provision and behaviour for learning are having a positive impact. Our effective PSHE education and robust safeguarding practices are also noted.

This monitoring report demonstrates what has and will continue to be achieved for the benefit of our young people. We'd like to thank our students, parents and local community for their support in achieving this progress and we look forward to seeing what we can continue to achieve together.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

E CAMBS

The Council leadership is reviewing the funding for the Newmarket Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB). We are concerned that the funding might be cut. The Newmarket CAB provides support and advice to people across the South of the District. Importantly, this advice is seen as independent of the Council. Whilst the Council may be able to offer similar support, it will not be seen as independent, and it will not be as readily accessible as Newmarket CAB.

The two planning applications have now been published in respect of the council leadership's crematorium on the site of the Mepal Outdoor Centre. Unfortunately, the timescales for commenting are tight, and will have expired by the time you read this. As it is such a major local development and will take away a much-valued outdoor activity centre, it would have been good if a longer consultation period had been allowed.

21/01054/DEM is an application to demolish all buildings at the former Mepal Outdoor Centre. The application is made by a demolition firm in Nuneaton. and submitted on 16 July. It was envisaged that the demolition would take place in the first half of August. However, due to late publication it now has a determination deadline of 22 September.

Meanwhile, 21/01216/F3M is an application for 'construction of a crematorium and associated service and administration building, function building, memorial garden, natural burial areas, pet cemetery, car parking, new vehicular access from the A142 north of the site and landscaping'. The original planning statement prepared by the applicant's agent, Nexus Planning, stated that the applicant was East Cambs Trading Co Ltd, the council's trading arm. A Councillor colleague questioned this, and it was hastily changed to East Cambridgeshire District Council. This is worrying evidence of how blurred the boundaries are between the Council and its commercial trading arm. The consultation expiry date for the construction application is Tuesday 21 September and the determination deadline is Thursday 18 November.

Attempts by the council leadership to find ways to avoid implementing civil parking enforcement (CPE) continue to founder. Almost everywhere else in England, 'civil' enforcement of on-street parking is carried out by the council not the police—but East Cambridgeshire's current leadership is adamant it will not take this on. To avoid introducing CPE like everyone else, East Cambs has tried:

- offering to pay for a designated PCSO to enforce street parking enforcement—but this was vetoed by the Chief Constable following the recent cut in PCSO numbers.
- using the national Community Safety Accreditation Scheme (CSAS) to give police powers to accredited individuals, including council staff - but legal advice to the council said that if any council staff were involved this could create a conflict of interest.

These were already obvious issues which had been raised at the time these ideas were proposed, and it has taken a year to get nowhere. The latest recommendation to use community 'Police Service Volunteers' to issue fixed penalty notices, was pulled from the Committee on the day of the meeting and will now go to full Council on 21 October.
