Westley Waterless Church was recently the very grateful recipient of a grant from Cambridgeshire Historic Churches Trust for £3000 towards making safe and restoring our timber turret. What was initially thought to be a quick repair has turned into a rebuild costing over £20k, so the grant is very much appreciated.

The Trust offers grants and loans to help congregations look after their historic places of worship. Its main source of income, apart from membership, is the annual "Ride and Stride". Each September sponsored cyclists and walkers visit churches, chapels, and colleges throughout Cambridgeshire, sharing the money raised between the Trust and their local church. This year the ride is on 9 September and will be visiting a number of our local churches.

CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL REPORT

Rail Improvements

I attended a Rail Summit in Cambridge in early July, which focused on several rail issues. One of those is the Ely Area Enhancement scheme, which involves increasing the number of trains, freight and passenger, that can go through the junction. If this junction is improved, then it would enable more freight vehicles to be taken off the A14. These works will cost a considerable amount of funding and it will take several years to become reality. However, business cases are in the process of being presented to the Department for Transport to try to get nearer to agreement on the upgrade.

It will be a big move forward in getting better services from Dullingham, as with improvements in the Ely Area, dualling of the line to Cambridge will not on their own bring the desired benefits.

Road Maintenance & Potholes

The comments on the state of the roads with the County continue.

Our Group have continued to push for improved road maintenance, which has not been helped by a lack of increase in the budget for the work, which with inflation causing an increase in costs of materials, means a reduction in the amount of maintenance that can be achieved.

The County Council is preparing a report on soil-affected roads, the fen roads, some of which are suffering from some severe road surface issues. This report was promised in April 2023 and despite many promises by the ruling administration, the report is still outstanding. I will update residents with more details, once this report has been published.

Weeds

The County Council Administration, without discussion at any committee, stopped the weed killing along roads, which has meant that we have a situation of verges not being cut to a desired level combined with weeds growing through cracks in the roads and pavements. Our Group is presenting a motion to Full Council on 17th October asking that this policy be reversed.

Congestion Charge

The issues around the Congestion Charge consultation continue. The GCP are apparently preparing business cases which will go to a full County Council meeting, possibly in October, where a vote on the scheme will have to take place before any scheme can be implemented.

County Councillors are yet to see any detailed financial proposals of how the proposed scheme will work and be financed. To present a scheme, such as this, to Full Council, without any chance for a committee to examine the fine detail of the proposals smacks of arrogance by the ruling Lib Dem administration.

I will update residents, as soon as I become aware of further details and will continue to challenge the GCP

over their proposals, to ensure that residents' views are not run rough shod over.

Buses

At the Combined Authority (CPCA) Transport & Infrastructure Committee meeting in July, I was able to remind the mayor about the issues that need to be dealt with in respect of the bus services namely, the numbers 11 and 12 services that run from Newmarket to Cambridge.

The CPCA are producing a bus plan, but this is still taking a very long time in the making. I will continue to keep pressure on the CPCA when the routes come up for renewal next April to get the service that residents want.

Bottisham Ward

A Youth Fusion Event was held at Bottisham Sports Centre, showcasing opportunities and support for young people across the District. Two other events were held in Littleport and Soham. It is hoped that similar events will be held across the District in future. Full Council in July approved the Corporate Plan for 2003-7 and the actions for 2003-4. At the meeting we made the point that the street improvement actions should not be limited to towns and Ely City and that streets needed to be well kept in villages too. We welcome the recognition in the Plan that the Planning Service, waste collection and street cleaning need to be improved. We are also pleased to see that after refusing our proposals to start the new Local Plan process, as recently as February this year, they are finally starting the process with preliminary work on a new Climate Chapter and budgeting for work to start on a new local plan from 2024/25.

Audit Committee approved the Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31 March 2022, and these have now been published. The External Auditors were unable to present their plan for auditing the Accounts for the year ended 31 March 2023, or even give a timetable, because of the significant backlog in auditing Local Authority Accounts across the country.

Charlotte is meeting with the Mayor and his Director of Transport after this article goes to press to discuss the problems caused now that the number 11 bus no longer stops at Bottisham. She will report back on the outcome next month. The government gave the Mayor an extra £2.3m for buses this year, which sounds a lot until you realise that the budget for subsidising the buses across the County - including the number 11 bus - is £7m each year. Under the current system bus operators choose which routes to run commercially, and keep all the profits from those routes, and local authorities have to subsidise any non-profitable routes which they feel should be kept running. The Mayor is considering franchising buses where the Combined Authority would be responsible for all routes and would pay companies to run them, keeping the profits to help off-set the subsidies.

The next meet your Councillors is on Wednesday 20 September at 6.30pm at Brinkley Memorial Hall.
